Usually, there are automatic safety controls so as to prevent the device from tipping over. When operating in difficult areas, articulated boom lifts are a lot more available than stick booms, especially if the application requires clearing surrounding obstacles.

Boom lifts are really popular in the agricultural sector where they were originally intended for use in orchards. This machinery allows the fruit picker or worker to locate and pick fruits which are high in the trees. Similar machinery is used by telephone and cable companies and electrical providers who do installation and maintenance on utility poles. Boom lifts could even be used for hanging Christmas banners and light displays.

A lot of fire trucks utilize a boom lift rather than a ladder. This boom lift is referred to as a snorkel and there are several window cleaners who use them. Boom lifts are used in a variety of industries. They are commonly relied on for exterior painting, and by arborists who should work safely within high trees. Boom lifts are frequently found in the construction trade.
